




Sydney is home to many universities and a large number of best quality public & private higher education providers, vocational and English colleges.

Vocational Education and Training (VET) is a study that provides you with the opportunity to learn practical job skills. It is an ideal study pathway for international students who are seeking a quicker path into the workforce as it focuses on real-world industry-based skills. Australia's VET sector is based on a partnership between governments and industry.

VET courses are organized by Registered Training Organizations (RTOs), which provide nationally recognized qualifications. RTOs include Technical and Further Education (TAFE) /institutes and private colleges (including specialized colleges such as technical colleges) but some universities may also offer VET courses in addition to other higher education courses. VET courses start with Certificate I to IV, Diploma, Advanced Diploma and the highest level is Graduate Diploma level.

RTOs that wish to offer their courses to international students must also be registered with the Australian Government's Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS). CRICOS allows the Australian Government to monitor the education provided to international students and ensure that it maintains quality standards.



Vocational education is more accessible than higher education.



It helps to upgrade the skills to excel in a chosen field or move into a different career.



As vocational education combines internships, placements, and other forms of increased hands-on experience, it provides quick employment alternatives and equips you for entry-level employment in the career of your choice.



VET courses have a shorter duration than University education: The majority of vocational programs are shorter than those from regular colleges or universities in terms of length. In fact, many programs only require one to two years to complete for an associate degree, and some can be completed in as little as six months.



It opens doors to higher education as students receive credit exemptions after completing VET courses.



Many vocational schools combine classroom learning with practical experience through supervised practicums or externships at off-campus facilities or with employers. It increases productivity, empowers individuals to become self-reliant and stimulates entrepreneurship.








Policies For Students Below 18 Years Old

The Department of Home Affairs must be satisfied that appropriate welfare arrangements are in place for under-18 students before a visa is granted. It is also required to maintain appropriate accommodation, support and general welfare arrangements for the period that the student will be under 18 years old while in Australia. Unable to maintain this requirement may result in the cancellation of a student visa.

Students under 18 years of age (16 or 17 years old) can apply for our ELICOS and Vocational courses.

Option 1: Accommodation And Welfare Approved By The Department Of Home Affairs (Arranged By Parents/Legal Guardian)

The person eligible to be nominated to take responsibility for the student's accommodation, welfare and support is identified as below:

A parent, spouse, de facto partner, brother, sister, step-parent, step-brother, step-sister, grandparent, aunt, uncle, niece or nephew, or a step-grandparent, step-aunt, step-uncle, step-niece or step-nephew and

A person nominated by a parent of the applicant or a person who has custody of the applicant and Aged at least 21 and

Of good character, and show this by providing a police clearance from the counties in which they have lived for more than 12 months in the past 10 years after the age of 16 and

An Australian citizen, permanent resident or be eligible to remain in Australia until the overseas student's visa expires or the overseas student turn 18 years old - whichever happens first.

SSC will not issue a CAAW letter when the eligible person nominated to take responsibility for the overseas student's welfare as per the Migration Regulation 1994 is approved by the Department of Home Affairs.

If you choose option 1 then you must provide the following documents/information for South Sydney College (SSC) record purposes:

Student Guardianship Arrangements Form 157N. Note: This will make a total of 7 points in this section Certified copy of your birth certificate

Welfare Arrangements - Evidence of relationship to a nominated relative

Welfare arrangements along with ID proof of the nominated relative.

Welfare arrangements - overseas penal clearance for a nominated relative

Nominated relative- Character Requirements-Australian Federal Police (AFP), National Police Check (Complete Disclosure)

Option 2: Accommodation And Welfare Approved By South Sydney College

SSC has approved welfare carer service and homestay providers. The student must have an arrangement with the approved welfare carer service and homestay providers.

SSC will issue a 'Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare' letter (CAAW) which can be used for an application for a student visa. In the case where the under 18 years age overseas student wishes to arrive in Australia earlier than the commencement date on his/her CAAW, the student must be accompanied by a nominated guardian approved by the Department of Home Affairs.

If the underage overseas student is unaccompanied, SSC must agree to extend its period of approved care arrangements to cover the student from the date of his/her arrival or the student must not travel to Australia until the CAAW commencement date.

Step 1. Contact SSC Admission for welfare and accommodation services:

Parents/guardians or nominated agents should contact the SSC Admission team (admission@ssc.edu.au), who will help you with the application for welfare and accommodation providers.



Step 2. Setup and approval welfare and accommodation services:

SSC Admission team will guide you to set up and approval of the accommodation and welfare services.

Step 3. Issue CAAW

When the approved accommodation and welfare arrangements are in place. SSC will issue a 'Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare' letter (CAAW) which can be used for an application for a student visa. The SSC Student Support team (support@ssc.edu.au) will be managing the accommodation and welfare arrangements for under 18's during their study at SSC. If you require further information about the under 18 years age student's welfare and accommodation or any other services, please contact our office: admission@ssc.edu.au.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS –



How many units are there each term?

Usually, there are 2-3 units/term depending on the course and term.

What English Tests are accepted by SSC?

IELTS, PTE, Cambridge English: Advanced, TOEFL IBT, OET, General English (Upper Intermediate), EAP from approved ELICOS/ESL Centre.

How long will it take for me to get an offer letter/COE from SSC?

Offer letters and Certificates of enrollment are issued in 1-3 working days (Monday to Friday)

Is it compulsory to attend the student orientation?

Attendance to our orientation is highly recommended because it will provide you with all the information you need to begin your studies, and is a great chance to meet other students. However, if you are unable to attend, please contact us: admission@ssc.edu.au

How can I pay the fees during my study in SSC?

The fees are set out in the letter of offer are payable on acceptance of offer. A minimum 25% tuition fee payment is required to issue the COE. Students can choose to pay more than the 25% as specified in the application form. Payment for each term is due two weeks before term starts.

What will happen if I delay in paying my fees in one term?

You will be entitled to pay late fees charges. (\$200-7 days, \$400-14 days)

How does the credit points work? What are the grading standards of SSC?

SSC's grading system is competency based rather than credit points/marks. Competency- based training is a method of training that focuses on a learner's ability to receive, respond to and process information to achieve competency. It is geared towards the attainment and demonstration of skills to meet ndustry- defined standards, rather than to a learner's achievement relative to that of others.

Can I work during my study period in SSC?

Students cannot work until they have commenced studies in Australia. Once the course has started, students are permitted to work a maximum of 40 hours per fortnight during the term, and unlimited hours during term break.

Can I transfer to some other education providers while studying in SSC?

Students are required to complete at least 6 months of the principal course to be eligible to transfer to another provider. If you have compelling or compassionate circumstances and you need to change provider, you must contact the college administration. A decision will be made case by case.
